Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy week of trips, visits and exciting lesson opportunities taking place at St. Augustine's. Some of our older pupils in Years 4-6 attended a rousing 'Rapper' event at the Incuba; Junior Police Squad took place for Year 5, Years 4 and 6 had an inspiring trip to Amazon and the whole school shared in a Great British Classics Dining Experience. We will be introducing a variety of themed days in our kitchen, some of which will celebrate various Saints' days.

In addition, Reception have been very busy learning about Traditional Tales and especially the story of the Three Little Pigs. Early Years are part of an exciting project called 'Hello' which is aimed at developing pupils' 'Communication' and 'Reading'. 


