She focussed on the importance of children not giving out personal information online (either through social media sites or when gaming); the importance of setting all profiles to private (in an attempt to prevent cyber bullying); the importance of setting parental controls (to help prevent your child from viewing inappropriate and possibly illegal content) and where to go should you have any concerns or questions.




