Teaching and Learning

This week has been Monitoring Week, where senior staff have enjoyed seeing the learning taking place throughout the school. We are pleased that in all classes, children behaved very well and showed good attitudes to their learning. Over the coming weeks, we will be working to improve the way in which we give feedback to our pupils in order to help them know their next steps for improvement and make rapid progress.

We are introducing 'Target Cards' for all children. Each half term, children (alongside their teacher) in Years 1 – 6, will choose targets for Reading, Writing, Maths, Science and SELF. In Early Years, targets will be for Reading, Writing, Number, Shape and Space, and SELF. These targets will be shared with you at our Parents' Evenings so that you can help your children at home. Stickers will be awarded to pupils for each target that they meet.

European Day of Languages



On Monday 25th September, we are celebrating European Day of languages.

Children should come to school dressed in either European costume or in the colours of a European flag. Please help your child to be able to say which country they are representing and be able to give a couple of facts about the country. For example, "I am dressed in the colours of the German flag which are black, red and yellow. The German word for hello is, 'Hallo' and the capital city is Berlin."


