

Our whole school attendance so far this year is 94.3% which is a rise from the end of last half term. This is now the best attendance figure that the school has had in more then a year.

As a school, as you are aware, we monitor our attendance very carefully and have done an analysis of our attendance for the Autumn term 2017.

At the end of the Autumn term, we had 26 pupils whose attainment was 90% or below, therefore classing them as being 'Persistent Absentees'.

When looking at their attainment, it was interesting to note that only 42% of Persistent Absentees were attaining the expected level in Writing showing that attendance and academic attainment really do go hand in hand.

Let's keep working together to improve attendance for all our pupils and give our pupils the best possible life chances. Attendance really does count! Thank you.
